Our congregation esteems worship that follows the Regulative Principal in seeking to balance the confessions, hymns, and creeds in a Reformed, blended traditional-contemporary worship service. We aspire to collaborative servant leadership with our Session and committees that follows the outline laid out in the Book of Church Order. In other words, Northside strongly desires to maintain our church's historical character and practice.

We trust that the Lord truly directs the steps of all His children, and therefore we look forward to His working all things for good according to His purpose. If you wish to know us better after this introduction, then we do hope to have the pleasure of meeting you. Until that time we remain,

A Brief History of Northside

Northside was founded in January of 1993. It began with the decision by Covenant Church in Palm Bay to establish a church in Eau Gallie. Jim Whittle was selected to be the organizing pastor. Members from Covenant began holding informal meetings and worship on Sunday evenings in late 1992.

We began meeting for worship at Brevard Community College (now Eastern Florida State College) on January 17, 1993. We moved to Rivercrest Plaza on US 1 in May of 1994.

Pastor Jim Whittle and his family left Northside at the end of 2000 and moved to serve a PCA church in Georgia in the spring of 2001. God called Jerry Dodson to become our pastor on June 3, 2001.

In October of 1995, we purchased seven and one-half acres on Lake Washington Road. The property was paid for in full in the fall of 2001 and we soon began building. We moved into and dedicated our new building on March 28, 2004.

Pastor Dodson left in early 2005. In December 2005 Pastor Jeff Godwin was called as our senior pastor.

Over the next 10 years we grew to the point that we no longer fit in our sanctuary. We temporarily moved to two services and began a building project for a new building connected to our original one. On May 13, 2018 we dedicated our current sanctuary. Our new facility is on track to be fully paid off by the end of 2026.

In the summer of 2018, our old sanctuary/new fellowship hall began to be used for worship by Open Kingdom, a Korean congregation of the PCA. We share usage of the facility with them and hold our worship services at the same time on Lord's Day mornings.

On June 5th, 2024, the Lord called Pastor Jeff Godwin home to his rest after shepherding us for 18+ years. We continue to grieve his passing, but know that the Lord is good and holy and working all things for His glory. In that spirit, we are looking forward to what the Lord has in store for us next.

Northside Programs and Activities

Our mission is to glorify God through faithfully following the Scripture, to love one another, and to reach the world with the power of Christ.

Northside programs are organized into Worship, Teaching, Nurture, and Reaching. Each program area is broken up into one to three subareas overseen by an Elder who is assisted by a committee chair.

Worship

Provide Worship and Arts ministry focusing the congregation on God-centered, joyous, and winsome worship.

Worship

Includes oversight of arts, A/V, decorations, the prayer team, music, and worship planning.

Worship at Northside is focused around the preaching of the Word. Sermon series usually are expository working through a book of the Bible, alternating Old and New Testaments. There will usually be five hymns or songs distributed throughout the service. Several prayers are offered throughout the service, including a longer pastoral prayer. Recitation of the Lord's Prayer, the Apostles' or Nicene Creed, or other confessional reading are done two or three times a month. Lord's Supper is observed monthly on the fourth Sunday. In addition to





Lord's Day morning services, we have traditionally done services on Good Friday, Sunday evening before Thanksgiving (Prayer, Praise, & Pie), and Christmas Eve (candlelight).

Music during worship at Northside is a blended style with a mixture of traditional and contemporary hymns. We pull material from the Trinity Hymnal, Gettys, Sovereign Grace, Maher, and other similar sources.

Worship services are streamed via Facebook

(https://www.facebook.com/northsidepca). While this was instituted as a temporary measure during the pandemic, we have found it useful for shut-ins, parents with sick children, and those preparing to move to the area and looking for a church. We also stream many special services such as weddings and funerals allowing people to 'participate' in these events from all over the world.



Teaching

Provide Christian Education and Discipleship ministries emphasizing strong minds and warm hearts.

Christian Education & Discipleship

Includes oversight of Sunday School, Bible studies, Junior Church, Youth Group, Discipleship, and evangelism.

Sunday School meets most Sunday mornings before worship from early August through end of May. We are off over the Christmas break and the summer, when many members are traveling. Classes are offered for children ages 3 and up, primarily using material from Great Commission Publications (GCP) or the PCA's Committee on Discipleship Ministries (CDM). We also have an adult class, usually taught by one of the ruling elders. Adult material varies, but has recently included studies from Ligonier, a study in Acts (from the Reformed Expository Commentary), and a study of the Larger Catechism (from J.G. Vos' commentary).





There are several Bible studies for men and women which are sponsored by Northside and meet weekly or biweekly.

Junior church is offered as an option during the service for children ages 4-7.

Youth Group meets most Sunday evenings for grades 7-12. It is designed to be intentional, fun, and relational. Our focus is to develop "servant leaders" who will seek to have Christ preeminent in all of their lives.



Nurture

Provide Congregational Care ministries to those having needs within the church. And provide ministries that develop and foster Fellowship within the body.

Congregational Care

Includes oversight of cards and notes, care groups, meal trains, nursery, and wedding and funeral arrangements.

Northside has a number of programs to care for members of our congregation. A group coordinates sending cards for birthdays, anniversaries, and other such occasions. We have Griefshare and Prepare/Enrich programs for those dealing with grief or preparing to get married. We organize meal trains for members following births, deaths, surgeries, sickness, and other times it is needed. We provide a nursery during Worship, Sunday School, and many other events. The church's ladies host wedding showers and baby showers for other ladies.



Fellowship

Includes oversight of community groups, fellowship lunches, parties and picnics, and our men's and ladies' ministries.



Fellowship times are an important aspect of Northside's character. We have a fellowship lunch most months after Lord's Supper worship. A few times a year, we do it jointly with the Korean congregation we share our facility with.

Throughout the week, there are seven formal community groups which meet to study, pray, and spend time together. We have active men's and women's ministries which meet about once a quarter.

Additionally, Northside is the kind of congregation which tends to stay at the church long after worship is over, talking, praying, and just spending time with our brothers and sisters.



Reaching

Provide Mission ministry emphasizing active congregational involvement. And provide ministries to foster Outreach and Connection.

Missions

Includes oversight of all non-local missions activities.

We support the Florida Church Planting Network, which pools support from four PCA presbyteries in Florida to help plant new PCA churches.

Most summers we send a group on a short-term mission trip. In the recent past, we have sent teams to Northern Ireland,

Peru, Romania, and Cherokee. We hope to send a group to Kenya in summer of 2025.

Outreach

Includes oversight of all local outreach activities.

We support several programs reaching out to the community and schools immediately around the church; a significant portion of this area is economically depressed. We support the Dorcas Outreach Center for Kids (DOCK) and the local Police Athletic League providing afterschool study and summer programs. We also provide Christmas



gifts for local elementary school kids. All these programs give us opportunity to share the Gospel with local kids.



Each summer, we host a Vacation Bible School. This past summer, we had ~75 kids from both Northside and the local community.

We have weekly pool or beach days in the summer and weekly park days in the winter. These are attended by many of Northside's moms and kids and are a great, low threat environment to invite non-members to come and get to know us.

Connect

Includes oversight of the welcome center, greeters, visitor follow-up, and the website.



Diaconate

Mercy

A subcommittee (Mercy Team) of the diaconate provides short term financial means to individuals or families inside and outside of the church. Each individual case is vetted for need and in some cases a review of their financial situation. The Mercy Team's recommendation is reviewed and approved by the diaconate.

The diaconate also provides repair or replacement services for individuals inside and outside of the church. Some repairs are provided by the diaconate members or a congregational member. Outside service vendors that have been approved by the diaconate are utilized to provide repair or replacement services (e.g. AC repair or replacement).



Before and after storms, the diaconate organizes work teams

to help put up/take down storm shutters, clear debris, and assist with emergency repairs, particularly for members who are older, disabled, or without family in the area.

Money

The diaconate is responsible for collection of offerings and depositing them weekly. They ensure debits and credits are accurately entered into the church's accounting system and reconcile bank statements and accounting system monthly.

The diaconate prepares the annual budget which is approved by the Session. Monthly and year-to-date Statements of Financial Activity are reviewed at each Session meeting. They procure quotes for capital projects, manage debt liabilities, and procure insurances.

Maintenance

The diaconate is responsible for the maintenance of the facility and property. Maintenance services are provided by members of the diaconate or members of the congregation. Services requiring professional intervention are carried out by approved vendors. They ensure all compliance requirements are maintained (e.g. Fire safety) and contract maintenance for equipment utilized by the church (e.g. Copier, Fire and Alarm systems).

COVID produced significant turnover in membership; we saw a 25% decline from 2019 to 2021. However, since 2021, we have grown by 40%. Not shown in the numbers are a number of non-members who regularly attend, a number of whom are currently in the process of becoming members.

Unsurprisingly, Northside's members skew older than much of the country, as Florida is a frequent retirement destination. However, a large proportion of the new members who have come in the past few years have been younger families with children. We have seen a significant boom in numbers of children and babies. After some lean years, we've had some issues with "too many" in some classes and the nursery, causing us to move some things around; definitely a good "problem" to have!

We are currently averaging 170 to 200 attendees each Lord's Day. Over the past 4 years, we have steadily grown at a rate of 20 attendees per year. When weekly attendance consistently reaches ~250, the Session intends to plant another church in the area. Beyond 250 to 300, our worship space will become crowded. Additionally, we feel it is important that the pastors be able to know everyone in the church feel that they know their pastors.

Since April 2020, our fiscal year runs from April through March of each year, so that we aren't closing out the books over the holidays or when members are making end-of-year offerings. In recent years, income has consistently exceeded expenditures by a considerable margin. The Lord and His people have been wonderfully generous. Each year we have used much of the margin for extra principal payments on our mortgage, buying down the interest we will have to pay. We have also been able to step up and fill unexpected needs of members, missionaries, and local outreach ministries.

The mortgage was originally taken out on June 1st, 2018 for \$1,744,655 at 6.5% for 10 years, at which point it balloons to prime plus. It was refinanced on August 1st, 2020 to 5.75% for 8.5 years. We have regularly been making extra principal payments. Even with no further extra payments, the mortgage will be retired in December 2026, well before the rate balloon. The Session intends at that point to take the current mortgage payment amount and set it aside for church planting.




Demographics

Brevard has many young professionals, families, and a notable retired population. The percent of our population 65+ years old in Brevard is 24.9% (17.7% in USA). Due to job opportunities and low costs of living, 3.2% of Brevard residents arrived from out of state since last year (2.3% national average). Race and Ethnicity






Cost of Living

In Brevard, the total cost of housing, childcare, food, transportation, healthcare, taxes, and other necessities is 4.4% lower than the U.S. average. A typical home costs \$357,500, which is 5.7% more than the national average of \$338,100. Renting a two-bedroom unit in Brevard costs \$1,380 per month which is 3.5% cheaper than the national average of \$1,430. This indicates that Brevard has desirable qualities that make it an attractive place to live even with its lower cost of living compared to other parts of Collected from: the country. livingwage.mit.edu

Income and Education


Brevard County mirrors closely national averages with regards to family and household income. Brevard has a lower % of people below the poverty than the national average. Employers and Industry

The Space Coast saw robust growth in the manufacturing sector, which differs from most of Florida and the nation. Although manufacturing jobs have been declining nationally since 2000, manufacturing in Brevard continues to take off. Since 2001, manufacturing jobs in Brevard have increased 19% compared to a 28% decrease nationally. Boeing and Lockheed Martin house headquarter offices on the north side of the Space Coast, while Collins Aerospace, Leonardo DRS, Northrop Grumman Corporation and Embraer hold major centers in the south. Technology pioneers such as Blue Origin, SpaceX and OneWeb Satellites are also adding to the workforce, using the same launch pads of the Apollo era. Space Coast Activities

On average, the sun shines 205 days a year in Brevard County. And in case you were curious...the average snowfall per year is zero inches. There has never been a recorded sinkhole or direct hurricane hit on Brevard.

Beach

Brevard county has 72 miles of beaches. Other than Kennedy Space Center and Cape Canaveral Space Force Station, beaches are publicly accessible. Brevard beaches are famous for their surfing. They are also great for surf fishing, jogging, hunting seashells, or just hanging out with the family.





Rocket Launches

Kennedy Space Center and Cape Canaveral Space Force Station have seven active launch pads and several more under construction. They support about 2 launches per week. The Kennedy Space Center Visitor Center is open daily to the public. You can get up close views of the *Atlantis* space shuttle, walk under a real Saturn V moon-rocket, and see the history of America's space program.

Nature

Brevard county has 117 public parks and manages over 16,500 acres of sanctuaries and conservation areas. These support water sports, biking, hiking, camping, boating. Many parks have playgrounds and pavilions for family and group outings. Merrit island National Wildlife Refuge has 350+ species of birds, 140+ species of fish, and 100+ species of other wildlife on its 140,000 acres of natural habitats. You can hike the trails or take the auto tour.

Local Education

Homeschool

Florida is a very homeschool friendly state. Brevard County has over 6,000 homeschooled students; 7.7% of the total. Over half of the school-age students at Northside are currently homeschooled.

Brevard Public Schools (BPS)

BPS serves over 74,000 students at 111 facilities. Last year, they received a high "B", overall, from the Florida Department of Education (FLDOE). 30 schools received an "A" rating and 17, received a "B".

Eastern Florida State College (EFSC)

18,000 students attend one of EFSC's four campuses. Most students are commuters and in a two year Associate in Arts program with easy transfer to FIT or UCF. The Melbourne campus is located about 5 minutes north of the church. High school students are able to take EFSC classes for free. Many of our homeschoolers graduate high school with an AA from EFSC.

Florida Institute of Technology (FIT)

FIT is located 15 minutes south of Northside. It serves over 4,000 undergraduates and over 5,000 graduate students, including many international students. Over half are in engineering and science disciplines with a focus on aviation and space fields. Northside has a number of members and attenders who are currently students at FIT and conducts a number of study groups for students. We are currently working to open an RUF chapter at FIT in the near future.

University of Central Florida (UCF)

The closest large university is UCF serving nearly 70,000 students. Their main campus is located east of Orlando about an hour from Melbourne. Many Northside young adults attend UCF via commuting or inresidence. UCF hosts an active RUF chapter.

Reformed Theological Seminary (RTS)

RTS's Orlando campus is located about an hour away in Oviedo, northeast of Orlando. RTS Orlando offers most RTS degree programs including advanced ThM and DMin degrees.

- 14. ____INVOLVEMENT IN LOCAL COMMUNITY PROBLEMS AND ACTIVITIES: Concern for identifying social problems in the community; work done with groups seeking solutions. Time and skills committed to community groups. Information and encouragement provided which enable members to become informed and involved.

- 15. ____CONGREGATIONAL COMMUNICATION: Two-way communication encouraged, information gathered and shared that will assist problem solving and decision making; varying opinions elicited and all encouraged to listen to opposing points of view.
- 16. ____ADMINISTRATIVE LEADERSHIP: Pastor accepts appropriate administrative responsibilities, in climate of delegated tasks and shared leadership; volunteers and professional staff encouraged to use their ideas and skills. Work done on developing accountability.
- 17. ____STEWARDSHIP AND COMMITMEMT PROGRAMS: Session and pastor develop a planned stewardship education program to communicate the financial needs of the local church and mission beyond the local church; congregation challenged to commitment to Church's work.
- 18. ____EVALUATION OF PROGRAM AND STAFF: Systematic procedures used to evaluate programs and staff performance in accord with goals and objectives. Others trained to use these skills. Regular assessment and evaluation.
- 19. ____CONGREGATIONAL AND DENOMINATIONAL RESPONSIBILITY: Value placed on balance between local church and Assembly responsibilities. Congregation and Session know and are involved in the work of the denomination.
- 20. ____DIACONAL MINISTRIES: Ministering to the needs of those inside and outside of the Church.
